

CONSENT TO RELEASE STUDENT INFORMATION

The Federal Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, commonly known as FERPA, is a federal law that protects the privacy of student education records. Students have specific, protected rights regarding the release of such records and FERPA requires that institutions adhere to these guidelines.

Written consent is required before the institution can disclose non-directory information. Non-directory information may include social security numbers; student identification numbers; race, ethnicity, and/or nationality; gender; transcripts and grade reports. Students must personally submit the form to the Admissions and Records Office (C201) or email the completed document from their student Volmail account to admissions@jalc.edu
